

Make sure research practice objectives are specified and measured for each piece of work

Stop posting bad work on Instagram

I've had to dial down my reportage work because of the Pandemic. This now feels slightly ignored - what can I do about this?

I haven't found the thing that I really want to talk about in my work.

I don't know what type of illustrator I am - have interest in reportage, narrative sequence, book illustration. Feels like I need this for L3

My portfolio website needs a radical update although my work is still not finished enough

I found getting started with Assignment 5 - self directed project, slow and ponderous. It took a while to find a pathway through

The unit should have taken 600 hours. I spent 1150

I need to start and finish books I buy instead of moving on to the next exciting thing

Copyright issue prevented me using a book title for assignment 5

I felt like I was ok to fail some of the time e.g. Assignment 4, some of the illustrations didn't work and were inconsistent

I didn't aggressively follow-up on the mural opportunity but could do if/when I have the time

I need to maximise the opportunities to match illustration with new situations to see what comes out

It would be useful to work on charitable skills and see if/how those could be exploited in work context

I started to experiment with gestural drawing

Portrait drawing classes took me in another direction that has been worthwhile with much scope to develop

I've continued the pandemic drawing with is now a very large body of work with potential for something

The ~~*film~~ sketch challenge is an interesting way to develop narrative illustration during lockdown. I really like the work created by other artists

I have made a lot of work

I can see how my drawing has improved during lockdown - I'm excited to see this and am motivated to do more

Use of video for reflection works well and I'm now pretty proficient at using Adobe Premier

The multi-dimensional thinking exercise resulted in really unexpected and 'different' visual results

SLOW - narrative sequence based on Bradshaw Cemetery work well as a finished piece of work but was also a good example of finding an angle to work with
